Local Inland Empire non-profits are working with the California Public Utilities Commission to connect residents to high-speed, inexpensive internet through the California Emerging Technology Fund during the COVID-19 pandemic.

You may even be eligible for a complimentary Chromebook if you are in a Frontier serviceable area!

WIFI RESOURCE INFORMATION

- [FCC agreement](#) stating that providers will waive late fees, not cutoff service for lack of payment, and open hot-spots.
- [Comcast COVID-19 response](#): offers free Wi-Fi for 2 months to low income families plus all Xfinity hot-spots are free to the public during this time
- [Charter Free Internet offer for 2 months](#)
- [AT&T COVID-19 response](#): offers open hot-spots, unlimited data to existing customers, and \$10/month plans to low income families
- [Verizon COVID-19 response](#): no special offers, but following the FCC agreement.
- [Sprint COVID-19 response](#): follows FCC agreement, provides unlimited data to existing customers, and, starting Tuesday, 3/17/2020, will allow all phones to enable hot-spots for 60 days at no extra charge
- [T-Mobile COVID-19 response](#): follows FCC agreement, plus unlimited data to existing customers, and, coming soon, will allow all phones to enable hot-spots for 60 days at no extra charge
- [California Connects](#) is an affordable broadband mobile internet program for the California Community Colleges. For \$19.99 per month*, California community college students, faculty and staff can connect up to 10 devices to the California Connects mobile hotspot anytime and anywhere in the United States to study, work, create and stay connected. Service can be canceled and reactivated anytime without penalty. (**Please note: initial one-time device cost is not included in the monthly service cost*).
